"Youngest In Charge" (Profile LP PRO-1280) Produced by Howie Tee

Profile's newest rap signing makes his awaited debut with a 12"-"I Got It Made"-and this album, which is completely without filler. From the opening cut, "Taxing," with its "Sgt Pepper" guitar-sample and declaration of intent, it's obvious that we have a strong new talent here.

Producer Howie Tee and Ed's deejay Akshun provide a perfect carpet of unusual samples and simple guitar-stroked beats for Ed's thoughtful raps. He's only 16, still at school in his native Brooklyn and already has the deft lyrical complexity of a Big Daddy Kane. Take a track like "Think About it" where the music is stripped down to guitar and drums to give the words maximum impact. Ed's the latest in a new breed of "educated rappers," extolling the virtues of knowledge over force (although the simmering threat of "The Bush"about his Flatbush stamping ground, not the White House caretaker shows that, if necessary, he wouldn't be afraid to use it). Against this, however, Ed's constant (albeit skilful and entertaining) ways of boasting about how his rhymes have made him rich get a bit wearing. But how can you resist "I got a frog and a dog with a solid gold bone"?

Howie Tee's production is simple and subtle, making use of some unusual sample-material. For example, "I'm The Magnificent" kicks off with ska legend Prince Buster's announcement of the same, before launching into a back-beat based on Desmond Dekker's "007." "Hoedown" rides a bucking barndance banjo and fiddles (and is very rude indeed!) Other highlights include the pumping go-go rhythm of "Monster Jam," the DJ's tour de force "Akshun" and the lowdown sinister groove of "The Bush" with its "ooh-ooh" choir. "Club Scene" veers into a hallucinogenic acid house gallop, while "Heds And Dreds" is bass-heavy reggae skanking.

PATTI FIRRINCILI

THE COOKIE CREW

"Born This Way" (FFRR 12" 886 513) Produced by Daddy-O and D.B.C.

Personal faves of this reviewer. The Cookie Crew are about to bust wide open and are taking all prisoners. These girls are fierce rappers, tough and deliberate with their rhymes and their style. You're going to eat this up. Loud, uptempo, and with a production rich with percussion and aggressive horns, you get the message this ain't no romp in the park. SO DANCE

Five mixes to choose from and they're all winners. Prince Paul's mixes deviate sonically in the way they were mixed. Outside samples are included and add a distinctly different flavor to the record. Daddy-O's influence is felt and appreciated. Terrific combination all the way

"Born This Way" is truly a body action record. A huge hit in the making, you'll see.

D MOB

"We Call It Acieed" (FFRR 12" 886 517)

Produced by Danny D

DJs, this one's for you. Those of you who tire of commercialism and top 40 will delight in playing D Mob because you can be sure you won't hear this on any NY radio station anytime soon! Too bad, because this one cooks from the start to finish, never giving those feet a break.

Gary Haisman, our vocal host, expounds on Londonese trends in clubs and musical tastes. He's got a colorful and distinct style. Acid-style deep house has been huge in London for quite a while and rapping with house is tremendously popular everywhere. Truly a winning combination.

Choose either the matey mix or the trance dance mix and know you're getting the latest and the hippest in Club sounds. There's enough bottom end on these sides to make your heart really pump. Choice stuff!

MO ARORA

HEARTBRAKE

"Never Stop Loving You" (We 'B' 12" WB004) Produced by Tony Torres and Jim "Hype" Heinz

First, I should make you aware that this indie label is for the DJ by the DJ. And this record is for DJs who like to see their dance

With a beautiful intro, breaking hard and fast into some serious freestyle/club drum tracks, you'll realize that this is not your everyday indie release. At 118 BPM it will fit into most moderate programming sets—and will probably be the highlight too! If I had to classify this,

I would say that it sounds like a cross between C-Bank and Cynthia. The female vocals work well with the overall sound. This is a sure

When the label said they were for the DJ I guess they meant it because this record has a lot to offer. There are nine distinctive versions-Club, House, Drumapella, Dub and Hardcore, to name a few. Of these, the dub definitely got my attention. It incorporates all the best qualities of this production and has a bit more to take hold of. JOHN GRIFFIS

THE MIAMI BOYZ

"Get Off Miami Boyz" (On Top 12" 8002)

Produced by Calvin and Carlton Mills aka Rockforce

When I reviewed The Miami Boyz album a couple of months ago, I knew there had to be more than one single among all those tunes-and indeed, there was! This is the second 12" from that

"Get Off Miami Boyz" comes in four different versions, including the A side vocal (4:23) and instrumental (5:10) and flip side "Bladerunner Getting Off Miami" (6:13) and "Icy "C" Getting Off" (4:30). Although the music itself is not very original, it is both infectious and danceable. The vocal rap is quite fast-very Miami and very strong. The instrumental has all the various samples and beats, but the rap is gone. It could be programmable for those who don't use too much rap. However, this record is mostly about the "B" side. The first cut is the "Bladerunner remix" (courtesy of the very talented Miami remixers, Felix Sama and Albie Nieves aka The Bladerunners) and it is a killer. It is also a bit X-rated, thanks to several of the samples tossed in for spice. (But, yes, they are oh so clever!) It has an a cappella intro that facilitates mixing and samples and cuts from all sorts of things are scattered throughout. Some of the rap also remains. It also has a very clever out ("if you can't find something to mix in by now boy, you better retire!") that's sort of a jab if you haven't already mixed out. The Icy "C" remix is also strong—punched up with lotsa scratchin' and the bass line pushed way up front. The vocal hook remains, but not the rest of the rap. Easy in, easy out included. Both "B" side versions are worth checking out. 134 BPM (wow!) On Top Records (305) 633-7127.

GIGOLO TONY


"Ain't It Good To Ya" (4 Sight LP 89-5525) Produced by Gigolo Tony and DJ Crash

It's hot off the presses and comin' right at ya-the newest LP from Fort Lauderdale's hot number one, Gigolo Tony. Let's see what's hidden among these eleven LP cuts.

Side 1 offers "Go Ladies" (4:40), a sparse rap aimed right at the ladies in the audience. "Mouth Of The South" featuring Big Ace (3:45) is a fast paced boast/battle rap with just a touch of Peter Gunn for emphasis. The title cut "Ain't It Good To Ya" (3:08) is a mid-tempo rap supplemented with both scratches and samples and its danceable too (102 BPM). "Please Don't Go" (4:55) is quite a surprise. It starts off with an argument that leads to a really nice slow jam filled with a bit of a sad tale; this cut is extra special. "Lines" (3:40) is probably the best "listening cut" on this side. It's a clever mid-tempo rap about all the "lines" guys use to score—it also translates those "lines" into what the guys really mean. Very well done, and probably true, too. "Respect" (2:58) closes this side with a rap about respecting others in various situations, and yes, Aretha Franklin samples are present.

The flip starts off with "Shake Your Pants" (5:51). Obviously this is intended to be the high-powered dance cut, and for the most part. it's successful. The a cappella intro ("girl if you'll sling it, then I'll bang it!"), as clever as it may appear, can be avoided gracefully.

The tune has two or three rap verses interspersed throughout, but it's really all about the scratchin', samplin' and cuttin' which are done to near perfection. Could be a floor-packer (122 BPM). "Blind Date" (4:10) has a definite Jazzy Jeff/Fresh Prince feel—it's an excellent comedy rap about a blind date. (Should make excellent radio fare if they remove a "word" or two.) "Life Is A Battlefield" (3:01) is a heavy message rap that bears repeated playing. Although it also has a steady, potent beat, this, too is red-hot radio fare—excellent. "He is DJ Crash" (5:01) is a danceable rap filled with scratchin' and other effects that demonstrate Crash's abilities . . . rather standard for this type of song; seems each one is similar to the others, yet each is a bit different from the rest. "I Want You" (3:58), a pleasing slow jam, wraps up the LP. Might be useful in several different venues if one is careful to pick and choose. 4-Sight Records (305) 564-6862.

MICHAEL PAOLETTA

ROBERTA FLACK

"Uh-Uh Ooh-Ooh Look Out (Here It Comes)" (Atlantic 12" DMD 1317) Produced by Jerry Hey

Roberta Flack is back on the scene once again and ready to take on the dancefloors of clubland. Her vocals, strong as ever, are the perfect vehicle for this Nicholas Ashford/Valerie Simpson composition. Combining artists of such legendary stature (the singer and writers) can only result in a memorable experience. Add to this remixes by Steve Hurley and Arthur Baker and you have one pumping club song that deserves to get the same recognition given to Natalie Cole's "Pink Cadillac."

"Something's wrong," declares Roberta at the onset of her new song. Believe me, she is not referring to the Steve Hurley remix but to the lyrical content that deals with a doomed relationship. Steve Hurley gives us a House Mix along with his customary House Of Trix Mix. Both pump along in true R&B/house style. The remixes give the song a hyped feeling, almost Todd Terry-like in style. This hyped feeling works well with Roberta suavely belting out the love gone wrong lyrics. These are lyrics we can all relate to.

Arthur Baker gives us a Dance Mix and Dub Mix. Arthur's mixes go for a more basic R&B, almost pop-like, approach. Simple in texture and perfectly suited for Roberta's fine vocals. Be sure to listen for the fine piano work in Arthur's remixes. Also, check out the similarities between the very beginning of Arthur's mixes and the very beginning of Inner Life's classic, "Ain't No Mountain High Enough." It brings back good memories. I am not sure if it was intentional, but it sure sounds great. 120 BPM.

THE MACK

"I Want You" (Quark Records 12" QK015) Produced by Al Mack

Quark Records, a label known for quality dance product, has a new release on their hands by The Mack. This is the second release by The Mack (a.k.a. Al Mack), and this time he had the good insight to feature the talented Kysia Bostic on vocals. Kysia sings with much power and emotion that begs to be compared to the divas of yesterday.

Starting with a Hollywood musical fanfare, the Club Mix quickly transforms into one pumping club track. The song is a good blend of R&B, club, and house styles making it very accessible in today's clubs. The lyrics, too, work really well, making it a song that everyone can relate to—"You give me joy, you give me pain. You play some games I can't explain. You make sweet love so good that all I can do is scream." Kysia's vocalizing is so on target that you will be wailing right along with her. Go on, girl.

Both the Radio and Sex Import mixes utilize samples from the much used (and/or abused) Ofra Haza. The only difference here is that Miss Haza's voice has been sampled backwards, creating a haunting yet appealing effect. The Sex Import mix is more of an "instra-house" track with the Ofra samples coming out of everywhere, whereas the Radio mix incorporates snippets of Kysia's voice belting out the song's title.

Already a top-5 dance hit in London, "I Want You" deserves the same treatment here in its homeland. I can just imagine the Saturday night crowd at the (deceased) Garage screaming over this one. 120 BPM.

DEJA

"Made To Be Together" (Virgin 12" DMD 1308) Produced by Teddy Riley & Gene Griffin

The production team of Teddy Riley and Gene Griffin are at it once again. This time around they are working with the talented duo, Deja. Curtis Jones, half of this duo, was in a group called Aurra

during the Salsoul era at which time he gave us songs such as "Make Up Your Mind," "Are You Single," and the simply irresistible "Such A Feeling," These days Curtis Jones has a new partner and together they churn out quality R&B music.

Clocking in at 108 BPM, "Made To Be Together" moves along in a very downtempo R&B groove. Don't let the BPM scare you, though. The producers have made certain to add enough bottom to satisfy DJ's that need a more hard-hitting dance song. Just imagine the SOS Band being produced by Riley and Griffin and you'll have a good idea of what to expect. One listen to this record and you'll know who the producers are, yet it is definitely not as hard-edged as their other productions. It is for this reason that I like it. It is a refreshing change of pace and the perfect song to welcome in the warm weather.

There are four mixes to choose from—12" Mix, Accapella, Dub, and Jazz. Listen to the 12" Mix and Accapella and notice how Deja's vocals intertwine so beautifully together. There are real singers at work here and it shows.

This is one record that should not get lost amongst the Spring release as it is quality music that deserves to be heard. Play it with Donna Allen's "Joy And Pain" or Electribe-101's "Talking With Myself" as well as with most any Riley/Griffin production. Enjoy.





TIM BORDEN

JODY WATLEY

"Larger Than Life" (MCA LP 6276) Produced by Andre Cymone

"Larger Than Life" is no disappointment to those who loved Watley's debut LP. This is "Jody Watley" Part Two, in terms of pop hooks and danceability. The star has stuck to her winning black/dance/pop style, again with producer Cymone, while adding some nice ballads for a change of pace.

Likely follow-ups to the single, "Real Love," include the pointedly paranoid, funky "Friends" (100) and the smooth ballad "Everything." For more uptempo dance format possibilities, try "Lifestyle" (114), "Once You Leave" (118), or "Come Into My Life" (118). As with the debut album, the LP versions of these songs are fairly dance-floor ready, so DJs can play "Larger Than Life"'s many worthwhile dance cuts in advance of the 12 inch releases (you don't just wait for singles, do you?)

Also on the LP are two more nice ballads, "Only You" and "Precious Love." There are four other funky cuts on the disc, for a total of 12 cuts, none of which can be written off. Congratulations to MCA, Jody Watley and producer Andre Cymone for avoiding the sophomore jinx and giving us another Jody LP to dance to and enjoy.

MADONNA

"Like A Prayer" (Sire LP 25844)

Produced by Madonna, Patrick Leonard, Stephen Bray and Prince I remember the first time I realized Madonna was more than just a pop-dance sensation. The song was "Live To Tell," and I was struck by how much Madonna could surprise me when I thought I knew her so well. All of a sudden there was this depth I never recognized before.

"Like A Prayer" is a big step toward serious artistry for Madonna. There is more variety, seriousness and genuine feeling on this album than any of her past LPs. This bodes well for Madonna's artistic legacy and longevity as a major pop star.

Yes, the fine dance tunes are still to be found. Check out likely hits "Cherish" (132), "Express Yourself" (115), and "Keep It Together" (103). But these lighter, fun offerings are now the icing, no longer the cake. On this LP, Madonna tackles complex issues artfully and with genuine emotion. "Till Death Do Us Part" is a heart-rending account of her feelings for Sean Penn and "Like A Prayer" blends the ecstacy of religion, sex and dance until they quite naturally become one.

The ballads on "Like A Prayer" are beautiful, musically moving and lyrically meaningful. "Oh Father" is positively chilling, with religious, romantic and paternal overtones melding together into a haunting sense of love and loss. "Promise To Try" is a simple, plaintive masterpiece, and "Spanish Eyes" is a breathtakingly gorgeous song on which Madonna's voice has simply never sounded better. Madonna does a duet with Prince, the whimsical "Love Song" which should go into the "quirky Prince B-side Hall of Fame." I have to say their voices aren't particularly complementary, though. Prince's indirect influence is also heard in the "Around The World In A Day" neo-psychedelia of "Dear Jessie" and the studio cacophony of "Act Of Contrition." With this album, Madonna has actually exceeded Prince in her mastery of mixing religious themes with sex and pop music, an incredibly impressive accomplishment.

There are many distinctive styles on this LP, but the glue that holds them together is Madonna's simple, clear, pure vocals and the tasteful passionate majesty of writer/co-producer Pat Leonard's perfect production. I could write a whole review on the production values of this project.

No, there is not another "Borderline," "Into The Groove" or "Open Your Heart" on the new album. Madonna has moved on. But there is still plenty to dance to, and a lot to think about and even cry about. Seeing Madonna dancing in clubs to "Physical Attraction" years ago,

ALEXANDER O'NEAL

"All Mixed Up" (Epic LP 44492)

Produced by Jimmy Jam and Terry Lewis

Great idea! Instead of just a rehashed greatest hits LP, why not include remixes of all those great hits? This is an idea which I hope catches on.

DJs will have fun with the new versions of O'Neal's great songs. "Fake 89" has been out on import, and hit big in the UK with its distinctive, very down-tempo house beat. And the nice Ben Leibrand club mix of "Hearsay" LP favorite ("What Can I Say) To Make You Love Me" was noted in my previous review of the 12 inch.

Other good cuts include Keith Cohen mixes of "You Were Meant To Be My Lady (Not My Girl)" and the early gem "Innocent." Two of my personal fave O'Neal cuts, "Never Knew Love Like This" and "The Lovers" are presented in their extended versions, and a Leibrand mix of "Criticize" should help DJs freshen up this often-played recurrent.

DJs and dance fans, "All Mixed Up" is a worthwhile addition to your collection.

The Stevie B LP, "In My Eyes," is very deep with good dance music and potential pop hits. He's the sleeper dance star of the last year, with impressive top 40 performance to boot. He's in the top 40 right now with "I Wanna Be The One," and the strong LP bodes well for future success. Play "Come With Me," "In My Eyes" or the ballad "Love Me For Life."

ART FREEDLAND

ONE 2 MANY

"Downtown" (A&M 12" SP-12297)

Produced by John Hudson and Dag Kolsrud

While pop interest is growing in this Norwegian duo nationwide, hopefully they can also whip up some attention in the clubs. Taken from their debut album, "Mirror," this is a wonderfully infectious pop/ dance single which captivates through melody and a catchy vocal arrangement. The track would be strictly pop-oriented except Michael Hutchinson's post-production touches on the remix add some bite, making it a superb addition to mainstream club program-

On his "Way Downtown Mix," Michael provides us with a lengthy break and a bare, almost a cappella outro for those who want to work the entire 5.47 mix. There is also a "2 Down Dub" mix, which shouldn't be necessary because the "Way Down Mix" is so complete. All formats—except progressive—will find this debut too exceptional to pass up. 120 BPM.

GIGI ON THE BEACH

"Friday Night In the USA" (Scotti Bros 12" 68231) Produced by John and Ed Polermo

Cute, adolescent, simple . . .not words one would normally use in describing a potential dance hit—or would they? One listen to this refreshing new single and you too may be uplifted by this novel approach to the dance market. With such an array of tired production styles saturating the market-place, something so simple as this classic girl group approach is a godsend. It's true that many remakes draw from this production approach, groups like the Go Gos and Bangles capitalizing on its familiarity, but this record draws on that sound with an exhilarating production that makes you wanna scream the chorus and dance to the beat.

The remix gives the jock enough bare beat and bassline to work in and out of the 123 BPM rhythm but the single is mainly geared in its production to being a pop party record. Those who recall Kim Wilde's "Kids In America" will have a good basis for comparison for this track. On the extended version the verses are pretty well bunched together so the flip inclusion of a dub mix may be helpful to stretch out the track-of course two copies are needed then. Perfect for mainstream radio and video station attention, this could be a next pop smash. but will it be accepted in the dance community? I hope so.

FALCO

"Do It Again" (12" 21178)

Produced by Falco and Mel Luker

Steely Dan-Michael Fagen and Walter Becker-are icons to many music lovers, who hold their works sacred, so it was with apprehension that I approached Falco's interpretation of "Do It Again." Would it be as tasteful as the Clubhouse version of '83 or would it be blasphemous? Indeed, Falco pulls off the coup with a contemporary production which respects the original. As with the Clubhouse version, the treatment is indicative of the prevailing trends of the time. In 1983 it was the "Billy Jean" groove which influenced the Clubhouse production.

LONDONCALLING

HE SWEDISH SCENE

Sweden is not a country one normally associates with dance music; one more often thinks of ABBA. Scandinavia is an area in northern Europe, close to Russia, that includes Sweden, Denmark, and Norway. Separated from Russia by the Baltic Sea, each country has its own character, and Sweden is often perceived as a forward-thinking nation, with a positive approach to poverty and social problems, rather than the "Swedish Chef" jokes of the Muppets. Certainly it has one of the highest standards of living in Europe and doesn't have a drug problem as such. In fact there isn't really a drinking problem either. Swedes tell me that they don't really have vices at all. Even pornography is a redundant industry since it was legalized ten years ago; the pornographers have had to move to Spain, instead.

Built on 10,000 islands (100 of which are populated), the city of Stockholm has been quietly dancing to American music for many years and as with many European capitals, acid house propelled many Swedish artists and DJs into the studio to make their own dance music. Two labels, Swemix and Telegram, lead the way in a country where the A&R people in the major companies (like WEA and Polygram) are middle-aged men who have lost contact with audience taste; rumor has it that one company sends records to outdated mailing lists, where some DJS have left the business ages

ago.

Telegram was launched by Klas Lunding, who started his first record label at 17 years of age during the punk era. Always the man with his eye on the machinations of the international music industry, he later launched a New Romantic scene in Stockholm. Last year, however, Telegram fired off with some strong releases. One such artist is Titiyo, who is the half-sister of Neneh Cherry. Titiyo was discovered by the young Magnus Frykburg, the son of a famous classical conductor. Between them they produce a strong Minneapolis-tinged sound that already has "Black Market" DJs fascinated in London. Her talent is so far reaching that she has recently signed a major deal with Arista in the UK. Telegram have also signed Rob 'n' Raz, who are very talented DJs, famous in Sweden for their scratching skills. Rob won the Stockholm DMC last year, and Raz this year. Recently they have been heavily involved in production work and their most successful projects to date have been with a ragamuffin rapper. Papa Dee comes from Gothenburg and is half Swedish, half West Indian. He first listened to Lee Perry at 10 years of age and started performing in his late teens. He was spotted toasting in clubs, and signed up. Papa Dee is unique in that he is the only Ragga man in the whole of Scandinavia. His style is lively and original and his last single, "Competition Is None," was a good seller. His next cut, "Microphone Poet," will win him many new Sweden is a nation of 8 million people and there are three main centers: Stockholm (the capital), Gothenburg and Malmo. While the other two are largely Rock 'N Roll strongholds, Stockholm has a coherent club culture but this hasn't always been the case. In 1985, a freelance journalist invited a number of DJs from different clubs to meet up for an interview about clubs for a newspaper article. While they waited they discussed common problems and agreed to form Swemix. The journalist never arrived. They started by making remix records, and like Disconet, sent them to 250 local DJs. Today they also mail out worldwide to 1,000 DJs including 3 in Beijing! Last spring at the same time as Telegram, they released their first artistbased record, by Deniz Pop. The team-René, Dag, Emil, Robert, JJ and Stonebridge—all work at different clubs during the weekend but meet up on Thursdays for their own club, the Bat Club, where they all take turns mixing rap and house together. To them the

hiphouse of Fast Eddie and Tyree has helped to combine both styles on the danceflooor, and both artists are constantly heard.

Since Deniz Pop, they have signed two rappers: MC B True, from Minneapolis, and MC II Fresh, who is half African. Both have made quality records that are hard to differentiate from some New York material and have great US crossover potential. Swemix have also signed Terry Leigh, who was born in Virginia, US. He is a writer and singer who has released the cut "Everybody Can't Win," a real deep house stomper.

All of the artists are black, unlike the Belgian New Beat scene, and came to Sweden through American or West Indian parentage. The country's immigration policy has turned it into a glorious melting pot of different nationalities without ghettoes or racial problems. Telegram's latest signing, for example, is the 17-year-old Leyla K from Morocco, who escaped to Sweden at 15 when her parents attempted to force her into an arranged Muslim marriage. She is currently re-

cording a rap cut which sounds promising.

No article would be complete without a mention of the most celebrated figure in Swedish pop, Alexander Bard. A pupil of the infamous Conny Plank from Berlin, Alexander has after many permutations settled with a current group called Army Of Lovers signed to SonTonTon, a Mute label. The group features Camilla, Sweden's most famous international model and public face, who started a model agency while in her teens. Alexander, an internationalist, has clocked up numerous gold discs for his English lyrics on Swedish pop records. He is also involved in a radical techno project called Coma.

Sweden, or at least Stockholm for now, is by now means backward in its knowledge of American dance music and is just as capable of making its own. They are also well informed with their main dance journalist, Kristina Adolfsson, living in London relaying reviews and news back to their national evening paper. It is interesting to note that the main import dance shop is also called Vinyl Mania!!



For Falco's version, Shep Pettibone's remix and post-production work utilizes the fluidity of a galloping techno-house rhythm as a base. Falco's mildly harsh vocal texture works well with complimenting female backing vocals. Shep subtly adds a progressive flair to the single with effects ranging from synth-spikes to samples. The 124 BPM tempo is powerful but gives way to Falco's vocals. Nice job!

lick Rick has dropped the second single, "Children's Story" (Def Jam) from his almost gold LP, "The Great Adventures Of Slick Rick." The self-produced single features the Knock 'Em Out The Box Mix. The jam & Rick are hottest things out and will be for the spring.

Public Enemy released a 12" remix of "Black Steel In The Hour Of Chaos" (Def Jam). The song is strong with powerful lyrics as Chuck breaks out of prison with help from Flavor.

Upon the release of **Rob Base & D.J. E.Z. Rock**'s almost platinum LP, people in New York City were playing "Joy & Pain" (Profile). Now the song is finally a single with an extended remix. The hook is the most important element on this 12" as singer Omar Chandler, on MCA Records, sings a classic hook from Maze featuring Frankie Beverly. He also adds a little flavor on a breakdown with some extended singing.

De La Soul has a 12", "Me Myself And I" (Tommy Boy). The disk includes three non-LP cuts and a sticker. The single tripping to Clinton features the Olbapos Mode remix with some extra stuff and shorter in time. "Ain't Hip To Be Labeled A Hippie" is a jam with the same hook as "My Myself And I" in which De La is upset with people calling them hippies. Posdnuos rap replies to all of this, "(we are) straight up brothers . . ." Also new, "What's More" (from the movie soundtrack "Hell On 1st Ave"), is a hyped jam with a simple static-like beat and strong and clever rhymes. "Brain Washed Follower" is a simple, catchy beat with dialogue between the group and a young boy named Jeff. He asks, if they are famous rap stars where are their beepers, cars, gold, and other materialistic things? De La replies that they would rather spend their money on more important things

like studio equipment and video games. Note on the B side each time you put the needle down you may get a different groove. Be careful; you will bug out.

Kwame The Boy Genius, featuring a New Beginning, is Hurby Azor's latest artist. The untitled LP has only eight songs and was released on Atlantic Records. The LP has many nice break beats, decent singing, and some clever extras. At times he has some problems keeping on beat but his clever lyrics make up for it. On "Boy Genius" he raps of his disgust with rap songs with used beats, but he seems to fall prey and uses beats that have been used already like "Funky Penguin," "Funky Drummer," and others.

Dr. Rock, an air personality on K 104 in Arlington, Texas, has released a single by the Fila Fresh Crew called "Fear Of The Rap" b/w "I Wanna Know What Love Is" (Get Live/Macola 213-469-5821). The jam is hype with some strong rhymes and dope beat. Kings Of Pressure are back with a long-awaited 12", "Brains Unchained" b/w "Slang Teacher" (Next Plateau) and a soon-to-come debut LP, "Slang Teacher." The cuts feature hard beats with strong hooks. The rhymes are clear with good meaning. Profile Records has several new 12"s, including "Shack It Up" by A.O.K., or All Out Kings, "Friday Night & Saturday Morning" by Einstein, and "I Got It Made" b/w "Hoedown" by Special Ed. The first 12" uses low basslines, looped beats, with some clearly delivered rhymes. The next 12" via England's Music Of Life label comes with an X-rated version and tells a cute story. Along with the Special Ed 12" comes his debut LP, "Youngest In Charge." The LP features many solid cuts with respectable and clever rhymes. A favorite, "Club Scene," is a hype jam which uses samples of many classic disco jams. The music and production, courtesy of Hitman Howie Tee, includes many clever loops beats, and guitar and bass hits.

"Dope On Plastic" (Tommy Boy) is a noisy jam with many clever sounds and samples by **Uptown**. Uptown, who sounds like M.C. Shan meets Super Lover Cee, also has a second cut, "It's My Turn." 

Larry Stenbachek's earlier produced (and Divine-intended) "Cha Cha Heels" has been cut by none other than Eartha "champagne-taste-and-beer-bottle-pocket" Kitt, and signed to BMG (for the world). Tri-Coastal Records in Miami has released a Danny "The Love I Lost" Tenaglia remix of Norma Lewis's "Surprise Me Tonight" (125). Also from South Florida, Jackie Moore's interp of "This Old Heart Of Mine" has hit record shelves (Diva/128). In LA, Rick Gianatos has announced that Phyllis Angel (née Rhodes) of St. Tropez fame is now working on the Gianatos/lan **Levine d'Llegance** project, "Ten Years Ago"—a Hi-NRG homage to the halcyon disco year, 1979. Guests who will as well lend their pipes include Scherrie Payne and Linda Clifford. With Hi-NRG's ongoing club and pop success in the North of England and Scotland—namely Italobeat and PWL product-Loading Bay is pledging this: "All we're aiming for is the NRG" through foreign licensing. Lonnie Gordon is back with a new tune. and singing under (yet another) new identity. Her new interpretation of the Raes' classic "Don't Turn Around" (Retro/132) was produced by the Micromix team, and ships under the name Déjà Vu (due now). And the Nightmare label is set to move on these forthcomers: "Street Symphony"—Nightmare Orchestra (like "Eve Of The War"): "Right Back In The Middle"—Angie Gold (Eurodisco ditty/130); "Do Unto Others"-Bobby Taylor & the Vancouvers (Motown meets "Boom Boom"/132); "Wanted For Murder"—Boystown Gang (134); "I Got A Feeling"—**Barbara Randolph** (NRG remake of her original/ 132); "All Over The World"—**Chuck Jackson** (melodic **Spinners** style/118). ettwerk has a huge hit on their hands with "Freemason" by Boxcar. Hailing from Australia, this two-year-old quartet originally gained some notoriety for themselves as an opening act for New Order and Shriekback. Owing a lot to the former outfit, they have absolutely no pretensions about what they do. Accompanying press release bills two of the group's members as responsible for "beats" and "samples." Forget drums and the like, these guys lay their cards on the table. Having said that, "Freemason" is a wonderful pop song with warm keyboards and a relentless beat for all dance floors. If New Order can be pop stars, so can these guys. (Singer David Smith sounds a lot like Barnie). I'm not quite sure what the title "Freemason" has to do with the lyrics of the song except that, having a girlfriend who doesn't live up to her commitment makes him a free man. I guess. There are three mixes on this 12" and they're all outstanding so take your pick. Robert Racic (Severed Heads) lends his hand for a crystalline production. "Comet" is chock full of beats and samples to provide the perfect mix record for any DJ to play around with. It's got phasers, vocoderized voices, electronic piano, tambourine . . . and beats, beats, beats! Funky in an offbeat sense, it's more akin to the instrumental version of "Freemason." Presently, this

Vince Clark and Andy Bell are back with "Stop" (Sire/Reprise) which mixes well with Boxcar. Released only as a promo 12", it will be included on Erasure's new mini LP "Crackers International" scheduled for release late this month. "Stop" features those darling Chalmer sisters on backing vocals and is a treatment of love—something these guys do better than most pop stars these days. Perhaps a bit fast, this high energy tune just doesn't seem long enough. Mark Saunders renders a great remix on the A side which accentuates, well, everything. The guitar, vocals, Vince's keyboards and percussion track are all brought out for your dancing and listening pleasure. The breaks which are prevalent throughout are heavily syncopated. In the history of this group, Saunders works well and serves them best where other remixers use a song as a playground for their own frustrated musicianship and tear the piece to shreds with no regard for the songwriter or the song. Expect to hear this on Top 40 stations across the country very soon.

From whence he came . . . Vince's "old" band, Depeche Mode, also have a new one out on Sire. "Everything Counts" should be familiar to many of you as it was released years ago. But, the band recorded a live album at their Pasadena Rosebowl show last year where they played to 75,000 cheering fans. DA Pennebaker (David Bowie's "Ziggy Stardust," etc, etc) filmed them on that tour for a movie called "101." That number is significant in that it marked Depeche's 101ist concert (the Rosebowl). The filmwill be released at the end of this month in select cities and celebrates the success of the foursome. Boy, have they come a long way. From the quirky cult status when founded by Clarke, these boys have grown to be pop stars creating a fashion for America's youth. As the first single from the soundtrack, this six-song EP contains the live version of "Everything Counts" which remains true to form and gets the audience singing along to the chorus. The remix, done by Tim Simenon (Mr. Bomb The Bass) and Mark Saunders, takes elements of the song and enters into another dimension. HEAVY percussion and a subliminal bass line make this one funky record. There's lots of sampling and lots of effects. Alan Wilder's keyboard is in fact as is a couple of David Gahan's vocal lines. This remix is by no way as strong as the band's original as this is a very emotive, anthemic pop song. However, in all its splendor, Tim and Mark's mix can deliver the band to otherwise closed minded DJ's and formats as there's no reason why Depeche Mode should be pegged as an alternative band. Alan Moulder's remix is closer to the original making it a good choice for DOR clubs and functions as a bridge between the above two. Moulder uses processed vocals, which I love, but it's not as strong as the Bomb The Bass mix. The EP's remaining three tracks "Nothing," "Sacred," and "A Question Of Lust" are not found on the album nor are the "Everything Counts" remixes. Martin Gore writes what I would call unconventional pop songs. Musically they're quite pop yet their lyrics are not the typical, simple "I love you" type. Maybe this is why they've had a rough time cracking CHR radio. The Gore-sung "A Question Of Lust" is a personal favorite. With its spot-on awareness of contemporary relationships, it exhibits a warm quality not always found elsewhere. I've always love the music of Depeche Mode though never really thought of them as pop idols. Having seen the film "101," I'm now convinced they are.

BOXCAR

"Freemason" (Nettwerk 12" W1-3026) Produced by Robert Racic and Boxcar

Leave it to the Nettwerk label to consistently think of pleasing the alternative crowd. Once again, they bring a DOR-edged record to the forefront, always keeping the dancers in mind.

Strong synths and a thumping drum beat often synonymous with "disco" are coupled nicely by Boxcar. The vocals are light and laid back in the mix with emphasis on the driving beat.

At 126 BPM, you'll easily keep your dancers hopping and although the extended version does seem to go on a bit, it is fluid and cohesive, allowing you the opportunity to manipulate any changes or segues you wish with ease and consistency.

Try out the instrumental—it's been mixed a bit hotter. While you're at it, don't miss out on Comet. Worth your time.

ART FREEDLAND

BANANARAMA/LANANEENEENOONOO

"Help" (London Records 12" UK))

Raising social consciousness through music has been part of politicizing for hundreds of years. Songs can send a message lyrically or, as in the 80s, the financial profits from singles can be distributed to worthy causes. The royalties from this latest Bananarama single will go to Comic Relief. It's a collaboration with Lananeeneenoonoo (don't ask-they look like Bananarama's moms!).

This remake of the Beatles' standard surprised me by being wonderfully faithful to the original and light on production trickery. SAW's production is tight and the ladies' harmonies are melodic. Good pop and mixable at 184 BPM. This single is a smash in the UK and probably will get some video and radio airplay here in the States. (This hit now means that Bananarama have broken the Supremes' record as the most successful girl group in UK chart history!-Asst. Ed.)

THE FLIRTATIONS

"Back On My Feet Again" (Nightmare 12" UK)

It's been too long since these ladies recorded together—leave it to lan and Stephen to reunite the original members and come up with a barnstormin' winner! Barnstormin' may be an understatement when you are faced with a track like this which clocks in at 180 BPM!

HOW SOON THEY FORGET!

Ten years ago the recording industry attempted to dictate to the record buying public what to and what not to buy. The year was 1979, the music era was post-punk during the height of disco, the slogan was "Death to Disco!" created by radio with the blessing of the record industry, the result was the near collapse of the record industry as we know it. HOW SOON THEY FORGET! Once again, the record industry is trying to dictate to the public what to buy—CDs vs. vinyl.

For the better part of the 80's, the public has been rebelling against the structure of pop radio, because pop radio was cramming bad pop music on the airwaves.

Our generation (and younger) embraced the "NEW ROMAN-TICS" and disco movements (Haircut 100, A Flock Of Seagulls, Thompson Twins, Depeche Mode, New Order and Madonna, etc.), because we wanted more than just Barry Manilow and Chicago.

At this point, Urban and alternative radio strengthened because they were listening to the disgruntled public, ratings for pop radio started to slip as the public was rebelling against formulated programming. There are changes now happening in radio. Through all this the recording industry, along with the disco movement, weathered the threat of collapse.

Now that the CD has revolutionized the recording industry, tape sales have skyrocketed and the recording industry (most recently major labels) are attempting to abolish vinyl. HOW SOON THEY FORGET!

WEA (Warner, Elektra, Asylum & Assoc. labels) reported 9% vinyl sales in 1988, A&M Records has announced lowering the price of singles with a "no returns" sticker, hopefully to prevent the

astounding quantity of wholesale returns. Other record labels report as little as 20% of vinyl sales which would lead one to believe that vinyl sales are currently plummeting. This appears as a ploy by the industry to scare people into following a lead. HOW SOON THEY FORGET!

Even if it is true that vinyl sales are so minuscule, what label could possibly turn down that quantity of sales?

Urban music, international music, or independent record labels couldn't afford to press in CD and cassette only formats. When you think about some of your favorite oldies, you can rest assured that you won't be able to find most old soul or disco oldies in CD form.

There is also the fact that Micro Soft in Seattle is developing a revolutionary computer component which will change everything about our lives, including music. The CD-ROM (Read Only Memory) will make computers an even bigger part of our lives, through its incredible memory capacity. The CD-ROM will also make almost all home electronic equipment obsolete. The CD-ROM will have excellent audio-visual capabilities. The prototype was displayed in 1986 and will likely be on the market within the next couple of years.

When the electric screwdriver was available on the market, everyone didn't just throw away the hand-held screwdriver. The glitz and glamor of the CD is mostly aimed at a wealthier, upper-middle-class buyer; cassettes are perceived the total opposite, almost disposable. CDs, in my opinion, are a suburban toy, while the old standard vinyl is an urban tool.

for uptempo tracks for their high-impact portion will find this one a real gem. Kinda pop . . . kinda fun . . . kinda fast!

CANDI McKENZIE

"Wanna Be Good Tonight" (Cooltempo 12" UK)

Before listening to this I wondered if my pre-conceived notion I had for the track would live up to my expectations. The mere idea that Cooltempo—known for its fierce, progressive material—had signed an artist whose production team leaned more towards the Top 40 mainstream was an interesting concept and one I looked forward to hearing.

Producers Jolley/Harris/Jolley do succeed in weaving a progressive feel through the 122 BPM track, as well as working in themes of Hi-NRG, techno and soul to perfection, while Candi delivers her strong, flowing vocals. An alternate rhythm is provided in the "Top Cat Mix," which is more in line with a syncopated groove. This treatment holds back the musical flow a bit too much, but still creates a nice feel. Check the 7" mix to see just how much was done to this pop track to make it pump.

Solid track.

THE WAREHOUSE PARTY BOYS

"The Warehouse Groove (Feel So Good)" (New Beat 12" UK)

This mostly-instrumental track impressed me for its quality pressing and exciting production. Its style is house-based with string arrangements, sound effects and samples which decorate rather

than overpower the arrangement. The 120 BPM tempo remains constant though the rhythm-style changes from time to time. Side B has an "Acid" treatment, which is more synth-laden.

iphop music meets the look of acid house in UTFO's "Rock The House," the group's fifth video with Director **Simeon Soffer** and **Soffer/Pantelich Productions.** The **Select Records** clip (UTFO's first in almost two years), mixes elements of psychedelia, retro-fashion and "Vogueing" into something that more than makes up for lost time. You can also expect something slightly more buttoned-up from Soffer/Pantelich for **K-9 Posse**'s "This Beat Is Military" releasing from **Arista** in the weeks ahead.

Not quite "Blue Velvet," but "She's A Mystery To Me," Virgin's latest posthumous video for Roy Orbison, has its own dark underside and is likewise, more than a little weird. Directed by David Fincher and produced by Propaganda, "She's A Mystery To Me" portrays a love triangle, the connection between the three leads rendered all the more mysterious in that Virgin is servicing three different versions of the video—each with a different ending. Virgin will also be servicing their first video for Ex-Husker-Du frontman, Bob Mould: "See A Little Light"—in-production with Colossal's Drew Takahashi.

CHR Popsters will thrill to the spectacle of **Debbie Gibson**'s "Electric Youth," co-directed by **Gibson** and **FYI**'s **Jim Yukich** for **Atlantic**.

Encompassing no less than a dozen dancers, lazer effects, Medieval fantasy sets and an unheard of four days of shooting time—everything about "Electric Youth" says, "Big" with an overall message perky enough to keep cash registers ringing.

Three out of three seems an unlikely rate of success in the music video field, but the chain remains unbroken with "Repetition," Mark Pellinton's latest for Information Society and Tommy Boy/Reprise. Shot in the scenic South Bronx, this B&W clip achieves an almost poetic look with artfully composed piles of garbage and essential props like yo-yos and gyroscopes. Also in production at Tommy Boy—debut videos for Latifah and Uptown that follow in the wake of their current success with De La Soul's "Me Myself And I."

The tragic and comic aspects of a life of crime are explored in back-to-back **Def Jam/CBS** video releases for **Public Enemy** and **Slick Rick.** On the tragic side is P.E.'s "Black Steel In The Hour Of Chaos," a story about prison justice and retribution directed by **Adam Bernstein**—better known for his work with **They Might Be Giants** and **Dead Milkmen.** And on the opposite side of the fence is Slick Rick's "Children's Story," an X-rated fable with the look of old tintype silent films directed by **Ric Menello** for **Def Pictures.**

Geffen will be following up such Wang Chung classics as "Dance Hall Days" and "Everybody Have Fun Tonight" with a video for "Praying To A New God," that offers media commentary in the form of screwball reaction shots. The clip is the group's first with Director Andy Morahan and Vivid Productions as well as the first released from their new "Warmer Side Of Cool" LP. Marley Marl will be conducting such All-Stars as Big Daddy Kane, Kool G. Rap, Master Ace and Craig G. in "Symphony," his vid-debut for Cold Chillin'/Warner Bros.directed by Lionel Martin for Classic Concepts Productions. Said to be a spaghetti western with a black point of view, "Symphony" uses performance sequences as a jumping-off point to flashbacks that comprise the bulk of the clip. Other "classic concepts" in the works include the Polygram breakout for Chuck Chillout And Kool Chip, "Rhythm Is The Master," which will feature new style rap animation and a musical riff from Talking Heads.

House music gains a new lever of commercial recognition with the release of a video for Inner City's "Good Life," directed by Silvey & Co.'s Andrew Doucette, which is believed to be the first sound-track video within the musical genre. Supporting the "Slaves Of New York" soundtrack on Virgin, "Good Life" is comprised entirely of pre-existing film and group performance elements that make a strong case for sampling as a valid technique for film. And equally groundbreaking are the two Silvey & Co. produced videos for IRS/MCA act Concrete Blonde, "God Is A Bullet" and "Happy Birthday," both directed, as previously, by Jane Simpson—who also completed back-to-back clips recently for Leotis and Chuckii Booker, two newcomers on Polygram and Atlantic respectively.

It may not be for everyone, but it seems a shame that NWA's "Straight Outta Compton" may be a little too good for the good of those concerned. As directed by Rupert Wainwright for Fragile Films, the blatantly antisocial message comes off in a way that is both emotionally gripping and shocking and perhaps just a bit too much for MTV and other programmers who have shied away from it. Hopefully Priority and Wainwright will fare better with Eazy-E's "Eazy-er Said Than Dunn," their latest clip.

Striking good looks and distinctive blues growl make for video energy in **Alannah Myles** "Love Is," the singer's debut clip on **Atlantic** directed by **Deborah Samuel** for **Youngstock & Co. Ltd.** Though mostly performance based, this one certainly projects an image for Myles who here comes like a green-eyed wildcat in red pumps and studs.

Enigma's Dead Milkmen recently capped their very successful run on MTV with "Punk Rock Girl" by performing an acoustic version of something they called "The Puking Song" on "120 Minutes." If you missed it, take it from us, this had to be seen to be believed. But hey, what can you say about a network that recently gave away Jon Bon Jovi's childhood home as the grand prize in their MTV "Giving Away Bon Jovi's House" sweepstakes. Surely there's all kinds of weirdness in this world.

With a level of hi-tech uncommon in 12" video remixes, **The Telegenics Crew** recently drew upon such technology as **Ado, Mirage,** and **Kaleidoscope** to produce some complex rips pulling away to reveal successive layers of footage for **The Pasadenas**' "Tribute (Right On)" which they recently completed for **Columbia.** Equally ambitious is **RockAmerica**'s remix on **Gypsy Kings** "Bamboleo" for **Elektra** which, in addition to utilizing both the European and American versions of the clip, also incorporated new footage of Flamenco dancers filmed exclusively for this extended version.
